The invasion of Ukraine rocked the continent and affected almost every aspect of our ministry here at GEM. And yet, none of this was a surprise to the God we serve. In the midst of uncertainty, we've watched story after story of lives transformed by Jesus.

At the start of the war, we gathered a taskforce to quickly assess the needs of the Ukrainian people and the border countries that would be most affected. Our team launched into a three-tier approach: Relief Now, Support in the Transition, and Multiplication of the Gospel. Through the grace of God, and your generosity, we've been able to serve over 87,000 Ukrainians with physical and spiritual needs as they fled their homeland.

Beyond the work around the Ukraine, we've seen our ministry continue to expand across

Europe. Our workers have planted churches, led camps, served their neighbors, and turned strangers into disciples. Though the last several years of ministry have been tough— a pandemic and now the war— our passion to see Europe transformed by Jesus has only increased.

I can't even begin to express my appreciation for your continued prayers and support of Greater Europe Mission. The burden of this important work is an honor to bear, but we couldn't do it without you. Thank you so much.





NEW BELIEVERS IN WAR TIME

The reality of war and its implications for those affected have been well documented over the past months since the Russian attack on Ukraine. Most of us feel a sense of helplessness when conflict breaks out on a large scale and yet the lives of average people like us are most affected.

For many of us there are clear steps of action we can and must take to help alleviate suffering, especially for refugees. It is often the most simple and basic things that can have the greatest impact on people in need.

During the summer of 2022, Greater Europe Mission staff helped to sponsor a family camp in the Czech Republic at a hotel approximately ninety minutes from Prague for families affected by the war. To date, the Czech Republic has absorbed tens of thousands of Ukrainian refugees.



Since the camp took place, our partners on the ground have had continued relationships with many of the campers. One woman from the camp gave her life to Christ and was recently baptized. Even now, other campers are going through baptism classes in preparation for their next step of faith.

Due to the success of this effort, Pastor Oleg hopes that with the help of GEM staff, there will be another camp next year. We hope so, too, as we pray for an end to the conflict which has been the source of so much suffering and upheaval.

Pray with us for continued capacity to maintain resources to help refugees in desperate need as the conflict carries on and Ukrainian refugees continue to resettle elsewhere. Pray also for the spiritual needs of the refugees, that many will come to know Christ because of the care shown to them.
